

2017 PREVENTIVE DRUG LIST



Preventive medications are used for the prevention of conditions such as high blood pressure, high cholesterol, heart attack, stroke and prenatal nutrient deficiency.

You may not have to pay a copay, a coinsurance (the percentage you pay after you meet your deductible) and/or a deductible (the amount you pay before your plan starts to pay) for preventive medications.

Please check your plan's prescription drug list and plan documents to understand how your plan covers preventive medications. You can refer to myCigna.com for a complete and up-to-date drug listing for your plan. You can also use the Prescription Drug Price Quote tool on myCigna.com to view and compare drug prices.

The following is a list of generic and brand-name preventive medications, arranged by type of condition.

Talk with your doctor when choosing the preventive medication that is right for you. Also talk with your doctor about available generic preventive medications (listed as uncapitalized medications and/or in parentheses). Generic medications have the same active ingredients, dosage form, quality and strength, as their brand-name counterparts and may provide additional savings for you.

If you use a pharmacy that does not participate in your plan's network, your prescription may not be covered, or reimbursement may be limited by your plan's copayment, coinsurance or deductible requirements.
