

## Part B Step Therapy Drug List

Some medically administered Part B drugs may have additional coverage requirements, which can include step therapy.

What is Step Therapy?

Step therapy is preferring a medication before another medication that are both used to treat the same medical condition.

For example, drugs A and B both treat a medical condition. Drug B, the non-preferred medication, is not covered unless Drug A, the preferred medication, is tried first. If Drug A does not work or if you have tried Drug A in the past, Drug B will be covered.

Step therapy applies if the medication has not been used in the past 365 days.

Step therapy drug classes, along with preferred and non-preferred agents, are listed below.
